As noted above, if you find that Mr. Dulin's race was a motivating factor in the Board's decision to replace him, even though other considerations were also factors in the decision, then you must determine whether the Board has proven by a preponderance of the evidence that it would have made the same decision even if it had not considered his race.

Has the Board proven that, at the time Mr. Dulin was replaced, it would have made the same decision to replace him even had it not considered his race?

To repeat, you are only to answer this question if you selected 1(c) above. If you answer "yes" to question 2 then you are to go no further and should simply have the jury foreperson sign the verdict form. If you answer "no" then you are to proceed to question 3.

3. What sum of money, if paid now in cash, would fairly and reasonably compensate Mr. Dulin for the damages, if any, you have found Defendant caused Mr. Dulin?

Answer in dollars and cents for the following items and none other:

b. Compensatory damages, including emotional pain and suffering, inconvenience, mental anguish, and loss of enjoyment of life: \$\frac{70}{000}.
